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## Tell me about the internships!

The Professional Learning Network (PLN) is offering the opportunity for 10 undergraduates to take up a four-week internship in a school in Essex during June and July (and still have your Summer break!)

These funded places are available following interview and can lead to a career in teaching commencing after graduation.

Working alongside qualified teaching staff within Physics and Maths, you can experience working in the Secondary Education sector in vibrant, innovative and exciting schools.

## Am I eligible?

- You need to be at University, studying for a Maths, Science, Engineering, Economics or related degree, **OR** you need to have a Maths or Physics A Level at grade B or above (or equivalent)
- Are you interested in teaching but want to check it is right for you?
- Do you enjoy working with young people?

## What are the dates of the internship?

You will need to attend our induction day on Monday, 21st June. The internships will then run until Friday, 16th July. You will spend these four weeks at your placement school, with weekly professional study days delivered by Initial Teacher Training Providers.

Most interns will work from 8.30am until 4pm.

## What are the benefits of the internship?

- You will get a taste of the teaching environment within a school, which will help strengthen your application into initial teacher training, if you decide to pursue this after graduation
- You will get advice and guidance on applying for teacher training
- You will have the chance to meet other like-minded individuals

## What will I be doing on the internship?

Your duties will vary, but will involve some of the following\*:

- *Observing and supporting teachers during lessons*
- *Leading one-to-one tuition and small work group with students*
- *Training and support from a school-based mentor*
- *Carrying out a research project*
- *Support of extra-curricular activities, trips, visits and enhancements as appropriate*
- *Attending relevant in-house training*
- *Completing a reflective log*
- *Presentation of learning to senior leaders, mentors and peers*
- *Physics interns will carry out laboratory work, including supporting science technicians*

## How much will I get paid?

You will receive £300 per week for the four-week internship, totalling £1,200.

## Will I need a DBS check?

Yes. We will ask you to bring some documentation to interview, and we will carry out a DBS check for you. You will not need to pay for this.


